

US Attorney Appoints An Assistant In Ripley

United States Atty. Thomas L. Robinson yesterday announced the appointment of 31-year-old Bartlett C. Durham III of Ripley, Tenn., as the newest member of his staff.

Mr. Durham will assume the post of assistant United States attorney tomorrow. The formal oath will be administered later in the week in Federal District Court.

"He was unanimously endorsed for this position by the Lauderdale County Bar Association," Mr. Robinson said.

The new Federal attorney has been associated with the law firm of Durham & Walker in Ripley. His father, B. C. Durham Jr., practiced law, was president of the Bank of Ripley and co-publisher of the Lauderdale County Times before his death in October, 1964.

Mr. Durham succeeds Jere C. Albright, who resigned from the Federal staff in August to resume law practice in Hum-Knoxville in 1963.

Born in Memphis and reared in Ripley, Mr. Durham received a bachelor of science degree in economics from Florida State University in 1957 and a law degree from Tennessee Jaycees, and is a director of the Bank of Ripley, an official board member and Sunday school teacher at Ripley Methodist Church, and the di-

Mr. Durham served in the attorney for the Tennessee Jaycees, and is a member of the Rotary and Ke Lions Clubs.
