

US Attorney Appoints An Assistant In Ripley

United States Atty. Thomas Robinson yesterday appointed a 37-year-old Bartlett C. Durham as his newest member of his District Court.

Mr. Durham will assume the post of assistant United States attorney tomorrow. The formal oath will be administered as later in the week in Federal Court.
